Dancing in Public is a FREE event that takes place on September 14th at 7pm in the Solar1 Green Energy, Arts, & Education Center, Stuyvesant Cove Park, 23rd St and FDR Drive. Donations will be accepted.

As a part of the [Solar One](http://www.solar1.org) Dance Program, **Dancing in Public** will begin with a reception featuring live performance created by [Rebecca Brooks](http://www.rebeccabrooks.com), with dancers Ursula Eagly and Emily Wexler. The evening will progress with dynamic screenings of several dance film shorts curated by [Jennifer Edwards](http://www.jenedproductions.com), Content Creator/Founder of JenEd Productions, and [Christy Park](http://www.dancefilms.org), Executive Director of Dance Films Association. The pieces speak to various interpretations of dance and public space. Moving 'bodies' range from construction equipment to school children, and dancing is carried out in spaces ranging from deserts to grocery stores to Grand Central Station.
